CAPITAL PROJECTS LEVY INFORMATION

Dear Frost Elementary Families,

2019 Special Election ballots were mailed to registered voters across Washington state in early April. For those residing in Lake Washington School District (LWSD), these ballots include a Capital Projects Levy for LWSD.

The Capital Projects Levy, if approved, will fund an average of \$20 million dollars per year over six years (for a total of \$120 million) to fund critical projects for student growth and continue to improve safety in LWSD schools. This levy includes:

Critical Projects for Growth - Permanent classroom additions at:

- Lake Washington High School (20 classrooms)
- Rachel Carson Elementary (4 classrooms)
- Benjamin Franklin Elementary (8 classrooms)
- Rose Hill Elementary (8 classrooms)
- Mark Twain Elementary (4 classrooms)

Adds capacity for 1,052 students.

Core Facilities/Common Spaces: Additional auxiliary gymnasium and commons space at Lake Washington High School

- Additional core facilities* at:
 - o Rachel Carson Elementary
 - o Benjamin Franklin Elementary
 - o Rose Hill Elementary
 - o Mark Twain Elementary

**pending feasibility*

Critical Projects for Safety:

- Exterior security cameras at elementary schools.
- Modifications to entrances of:
 - o Eastlake High School
 - o Lake Washington High School
 - o Redmond High School
